Teachers' Professional Learning

Throughout the academic year of 2022-2023, all staff members took part in a number of training opportunities. These included Accelerated Reader training, Outdoor learning training, Autism training, Child Protection training and First Aid training. Curriculum

A one-year School Development Plan was written for the school year 2022-2023. This plan focused on ensuring high quality of provision for children, as well as promoting the health and well-being of staff and pupils. There was also an emphasis on developing the Outdoor learning area and building links with the local community. Circular leaders continued to plan for the delivery of the NI curriculum at a whole school level, and individual teachers planned for, and delivered lessons in line with the NI Curriculum. Lessons were differentiated to meet the needs of all learners. Children with additional needs were catered for through an IEP and had one-to-one support lessons with their teacher and LSA on a weekly basis.

Funding was received from DENI to allow Woodlawn Primary School to employ an Engage teacher to support children in their learning. Over the year, Miss Wallace worked with small groups to help boost learning in numeracy and literacy across the whole school.

Attendance

The school's attendance across the school year was 92%. The school did not have an allocated EWO worker this year so monthly meetings to monitor attendance did not take place. The school management monitored pupil attendance and 2 families were supported through the EWO service.

Extended Schools

Woodlawn Primary School received Extended Schools funding for 2022 - 2023. This funding allowed school to provide a free Breakfast Club and a free 2 o'clock club to extend the school day for our children. Extended Schools allowed Woodlawn Primary School to employ a School Counsellor who worked with 9 children over the year.

Financial Report

Woodlawn Primary School is a fully-delegated school. This means that the Governors are

responsible for managing the entire school budget.

The amount of money allocated to the Governors to run the school (formula funding) depends

largely on the number of pupils on rolls, with other factors such as the number of children who

receive Free School Meals, the number of Newcomer pupils and pupils with Special Educational

Needs also being taken into account. This money is allocated for a financial year.

Many of the school's financial commitments are actually predetermined by outside agencies, e.g.

basic staff costs, maintenance costs, etc., leaving the Governors approximately 10% of the school's

budget to allocate according to their particular priorities.

The school's initial formula budget was £552,215

Additional funding was allocated throughout the year to employ an Engage teacher and to allow the

SENCo to be released for Annual Reviews and updating the SEN register. School was also given

an additional £6290 to assist with a national rise in energy costings. In 2022-2023, Woodlawn

Primary School spent £750,412. The financial year ended with school having a deficit in their LMS

account.

Private funds

Woodlawn Primary School also has a private bank account with Danske Bank. Money is paid in to

this account for school dinners, school trips, milk etc.

The Private Fund account was successfully audited in March 2023. The audit process is now an

established event in the school calendar.

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PTFA

The PTFA was re-established in September and has 7 members. The chairperson is Carla Wright,

Secretary is Jillian McConkey and Treasurer is Holly Dawson. The PTFA meets once per half

term and is responsible for raising funds for the school. The PTFA organised several fundraising

events throughout the year including a Christmas Ballot, Valentine's Day competition and a

Sponsored Walk. Over the year, £3128.91 which was used to pay for Coronation decorations and

to design and create a sensory room.

ETI Visit – October 2022

The Educational Training Inspectorate are responsible for ensuring good standard of education

across Northern Ireland. Woodlawn had been having input from ETI since 2015 and a visit was

scheduled for October 2022. During this visit, 3 inspectors observed lessons, interviewed learners,

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examined children's work and interviewed key coordinators and members of management. This was a very positive experience, and the inspectors were able to identify many positive things about our school. They reported a positive ethos, highly effective practice, supportive staff, high levels of pupil participation and excellent resources to enhance outdoor learning. The inspectors reported improvements in all areas of school and both governors and staff were very pleased with the feedback. The full report can be accessed via

Looking Ahead

Like all schools, Woodlawn Primary School has been hit by the reduction of funding to schools. Despite this financial hit, the school staff have continued to provide a safe, caring and nurturing environment for the school community. The school management team will be looking at grants to apply for to assist with the funding shortfall. These grants include Live here, Love here and the Awards for All grant from the National Lottery. As school looks to the new school year, there are plans to further develop the outdoor learning areas to allow Key Stage 2 classes to benefit from outdoor learning. Plans are in place to develop a community garden and to train two staff members in Forest Schools. A new one-year development plan will be written, taking into account of the Outdoor learning focus, as well as ensuring that all children continue to have access to a broad and balanced curriculum and where they can all achieve their potential during their time in Woodlawn Primary School.
